

# Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes

## October 21, 2015

Louisville Metro Solid Waste, 600 Meriwether Avenue

❖ Meeting was called to order by Chairman Greg Zahradnik, at 4:40 p.m.

Committee members in attendance were Darrell Shelton, Marie Burnett, Bob Schindler, Bruce Burrow, Bruce Blue, Pat Stallard, Sarah Lynn Cunningham and Bob Lee.

❖ August 19<sup>th</sup> and September 16<sup>th</sup> Meeting Minutes were accepted by acclamation.

### Staff Report Review included in packet - Pete Flood asked for any questions:

1. **Host Agreement:** *Sarah Lynn Cunningham* asked for an update. Group has not met. Keith Hackett spoke to Tim Wells and won't have the first review for us until their legal department reviews it. They have allowed the host agreement to function as is. There was a miscommunication in the last meeting where not everyone got the invite. Next invite will require a response to make sure everyone invited received it.
2. **10 Year Feasibility Plan:** *Darrell Shelton* asked who the core team is. Response: League of Cities, Bob Schindler, Joyce St. Clair, Greg Zahradnik and staff. Next meeting for stakeholders is in November. *Mr. Flood* will send the PowerPoint presentation that was presented, to the members by email. Consultants will be back in town December 7<sup>th</sup>, which is for the waste characterization portion. 2<sup>nd</sup> phase will be in April.
3. **Enforcement Activities:** *Ms. Cunningham* asked about the # of licensed Waste Haulers and Transfer Stations that has increased since 1990's. (Response) It is not specifically just waste haulers picking up residential. It's also everyone with dumpster services. Medical waste is going to transfer stations which increased that number.  
*Darrell Shelton* asked if all of the licensed companies were published on the website with a response of not currently but will have them added on.
4. **Education Activities:** No questions.
5. **Staffed Recycling Centers:** No questions.
6. **Litter Abatement Activities:** No questions.
7. **Other Projects ~ Coca Cola Recycling Initiative:** This program has already taken place in other cities such as Nashville. It is a county wide program just starting up where mailings went out to 326,000 single family households to encourage recycling. The mailing had two stickers in it to place on their recycling container for a random drawing. If Coca Cola prize patrol rides by a household with the sticker on the container, their address gets entered for a \$50 gift certificate. It's a 6 month program and if you didn't get one by mail, Kroger stores have them for pickup.  
*Bruce Burrow* stated they knew nothing about it and are very particular about what residents put on their containers at Rumpke.  
*Ms. Cunningham* asked what the purpose of it was since we aren't having a bottle ban or such. What are they after such as email addresses or names? (Response) Recycling content is needed currently and this is Coca Cola's way of reaching out therefore they paid for the addresses from PVA.
